Byers paves the way for new Heathrow runway

4 The Government left open the prospect of a third runway* at Heathrow yesterday as it approved a fifth terminal for the airport despite opposition from environmental groups and residents living beneath the flightpath.

5 Stephen Byers, the Transport Secretary, said that the £2.25 billion terminal, due to open in 2007, was 'in the national interest'.

British Airways is lobbying hard for a third runway, which could see two villages and 3-4,000 homes demolished. Mr Byers says that the issue should be considered in the current review of airports policy, which is due to report next autumn.

10 Residents who opposed Terminal 5 said that they remained suspicious of any pledges on limiting the growth of Heathrow because commitments had repeatedly been broken before.

The Government has until January 2 to decide whether to appeal against last month's ruling by the European Court of Human Rights that night flights breached the right of residents to a good night's sleep.
